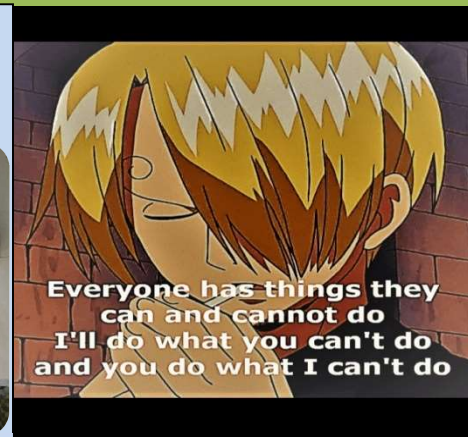
## TEACHERS' DAY PROGRAM
