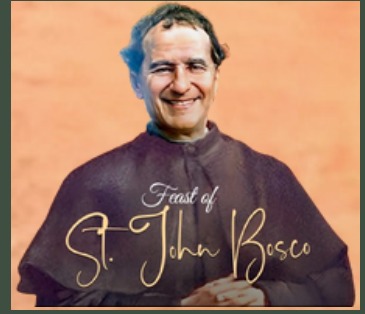


## Inauguration of Bosco Cafe

## Workshop on SSR Preparation at Don Bosco College Itanagar

The staff and faculty of Salesian College of Higher Education, Dimapur, attended a 2-day workshop on SSR preparation and assessment organized by IQAC, Don Bosco College, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh. The workshop aimed to provide training for the preparation of reports and documents for the NAAC assessment. It was held in Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh, from the 27th to the 28th of January, 2024.
