



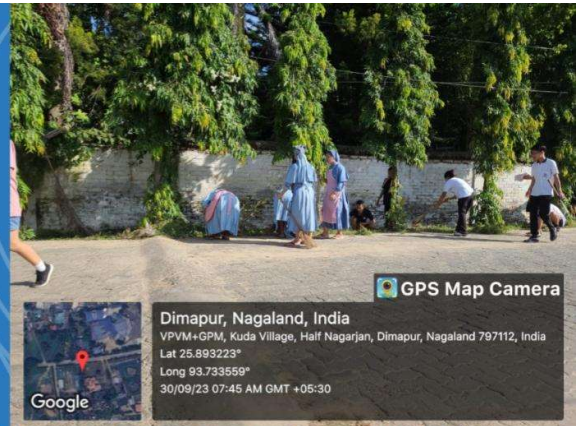

**Seminar on the topic "The Surge of AI: Understanding Human Technology"**

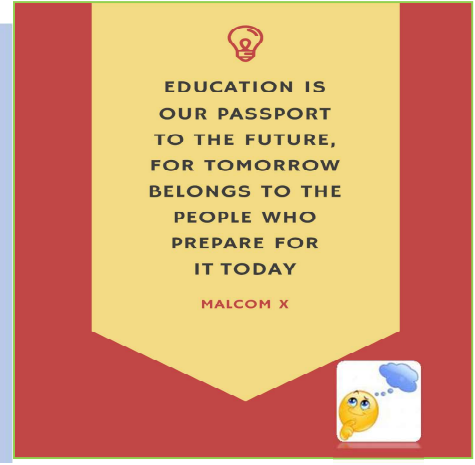
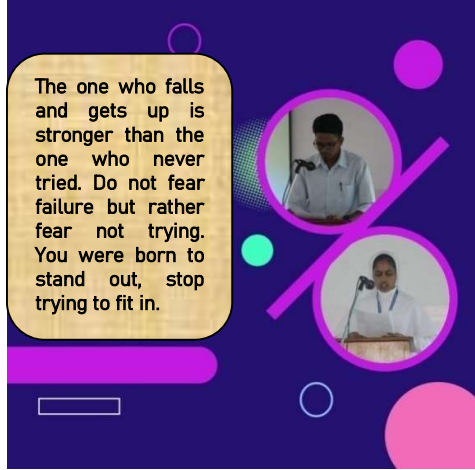
On October 3, 2023, the Philosophy Department organized a thought-provoking seminar to explore the Surge of AI: **Understanding Human Technology.**

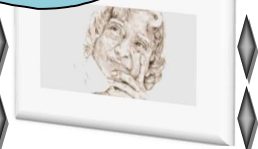

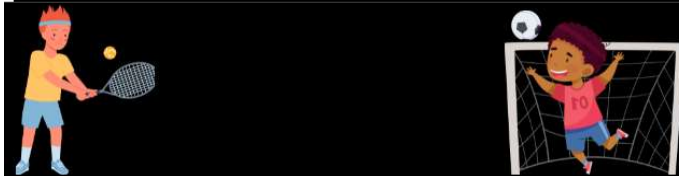
## ANGLE HOME
