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NSS Club Organises Camp at Salesian College



The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Salesian College of Higher Education organized a three-day NSS camp from August 1 to 3, 2024, with the participation of 20 enthusiastic volunteers. The camp aimed at fostering community service and learning, with activities centered on the adopted village, Master Colony.

Under the leadership of NSS President Dhiraj and Program Officers Sir Yanvuntgthung, Sir Abel, and Miss Lomi, the camp started with a meeting to discuss the programs planned for the adopted village. On the first day, the volunteers visited Master Colony, followed by team-building activities at night.

The second day featured an educational tour to the Nagaland Handloom and Handicrafts Development Corporation Limited, where volunteers learned about handicraft production and trade. The day concluded with engaging games and sessions for the villagers, fostering positive interactions and learning.

The final day saw the volunteers construct eco-friendly bamboo dustbins for Master Colony, a step towards environmental sustainability. The camp concluded with group photos and discussions on future initiatives, providing the students with valuable insights into community service and sustainable development.

1st National Space Day 2024 Celebrated at Salesian College

Salesian College of Higher Education commemorated the first National Space Day with enthusiasm on Friday, August 23, 2024. Organized by the Political Science Department, the event celebrated India's achievements in space exploration, particularly the successful landing of the Vikram Lander from Chandrayaan-3 on the lunar surface.

The celebration commenced at 10:20 AM with Seiminhoa as the Master of Ceremonies. A Bible reading from Matthew 7:7 set a reflective tone, highlighting the day's theme of striving for success. This was followed by a speech marking India's remarkable achievement in becoming the fourth nation to land on the Moon and the first to reach the South Pole.

Brother Alex then moved the audience with a heartfelt rendition of "I Have a Dream," adding an emotional layer to the celebration. Rector Rev. Fr. Dr. Elow Samuel inspired students with a message about the importance of values, reminding them that small actions contribute to success. He urged them to be inventive and work closely with their teachers, emphasizing diligence and integrity. The program concluded with the singing of the national anthem, marking a respectful end to the commemorations and leaving participants with a renewed sense of patriotism and collective identity.


Salesian College Clubs Unite for Social Work and Friendly Matches
