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ONE-DAY WORKSHOP: RAINWATER HARVESTING & GROUNDWATER RECHARGING

This one-day workshop was organized by the Eco Club of Salesian College of Higher Education and the Bosco College of Teacher Education, in collaboration with Dimapur Government College (DGC) under the PM-USHA Monitoring Cell, DGC initiative, and funded by the Ministry of Education under PM-USHA, Government of India. The workshop was conducted on the theme: Ensuring Sustainable Water Availability.

The programme commenced with Fr. Dr. Paul Puni, Principal of Salesian College of Higher Education, as Chairperson. The National Anthem was followed by a welcome address by Fr. Dr. Jose Joseph, Principal, Bosco College of Teacher Education.

The Departments of Philosophy at Salesian College of Higher Education (SCHE) and Dimapur Government College (DGC), jointly organized an intercollege dialogue on two topics. This event marked a significant milestone in strengthening inter-institutional collaboration and philosophical engagement. The theme “Bridging Minds, Building Meaning” served as both a conceptual anchor and a pedagogical provocation, inviting participants to reflect on the role of Philosophy in an era shaped by technological acceleration and epistemic uncertainty.

The event commenced with an introductory session led by N. Sentinungla Pongen, Head of Department, Philosophy at DG, who emphasized the importance of cultivating spaces for shared inquiry, especially among students navigating the complexities of modern education.

Session 1: Students in the Age of Technology and AI. This session explored the philosophical implications of digital transformation on student identity, agency and learning. Drawing on phenomenological insights, the session examined how AI and digital platforms mediate students’ engagement with knowledge, often privileging speed and efficiency over depth and contemplation.

Session 2: The Relevance of Philosophy Today. This session reaffirmed the enduring relevance of Philosophy in addressing contemporary challenges. Participants explored how philosophical thinking can resist reductive narratives, whether it is technology, consumerism, or cultural loss that can be tackled by learning to think critically and act ethically.

The intercollege dialogue ended with an aim to deepen philosophical literacy, encourage ethical reflection and build enduring academic ties not just between philosophy but across disciplines to contribute to a more reflective and informed academic culture.
